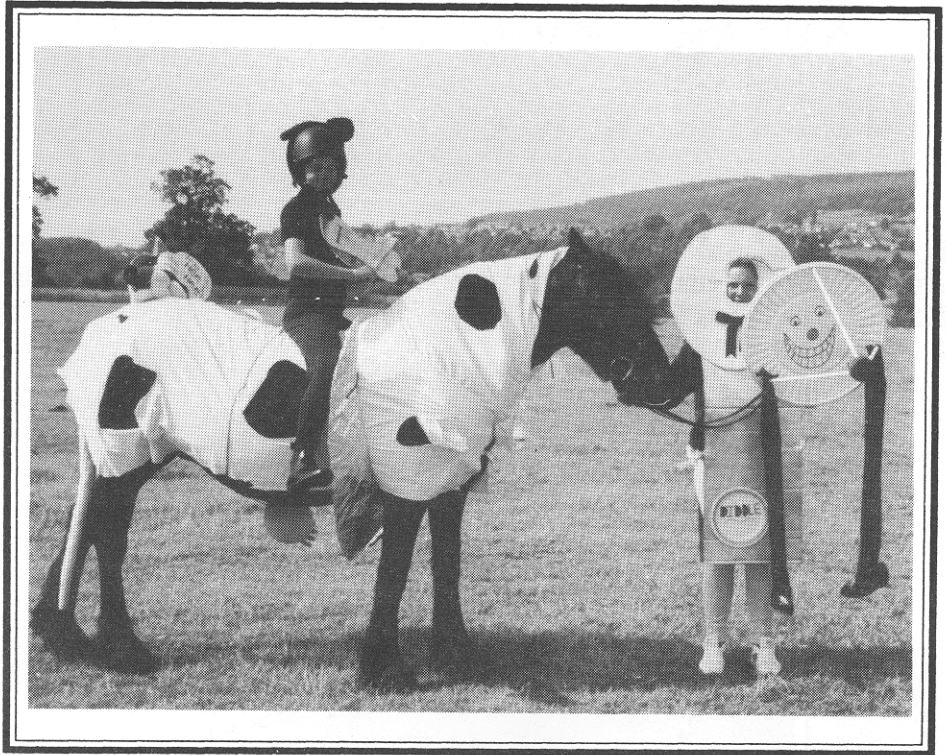


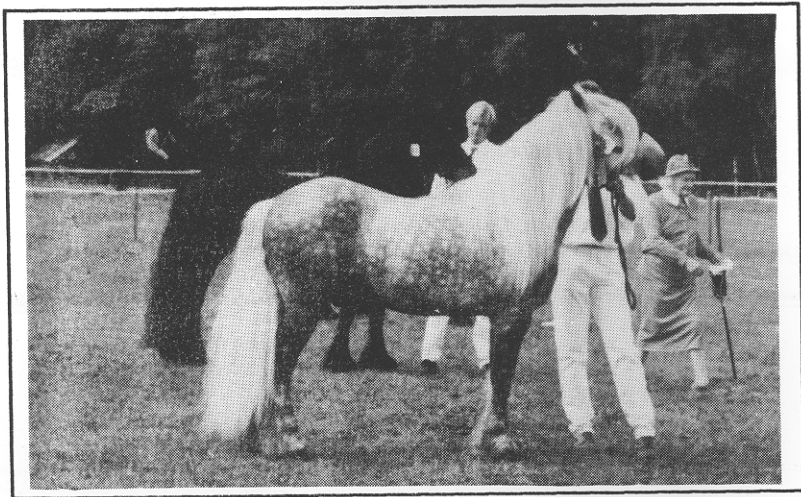

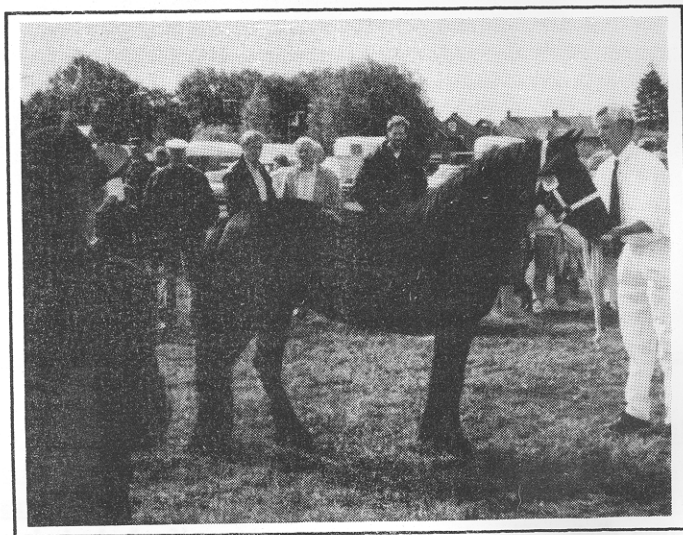

The Society's financial year now ends on the 31st October, which is why the Autumn General Meeting is earlier this year and will be so in the future. The Council is very grateful to Derek Scott for steering us through this complicated innovation with as little disruption as possible to our rules and traditions.

We regret that the Council have decided to raise the registration fees, stallion licensing and prefixes etc., all the details of which are in this Newsletter. Our overheads get bigger every year, the Horserace Betting Levy Board Grant is beginning to shrink and we have little spare money in case of unseen circumstances so I hope you will forgive us and dig a little deeper and buy a ticket and come to our social in November. I hope you have all bought Raffle Tickets. Every little helps!

REVIEW OF FPS OPEN DAY AND JUDGES TEACH-IN

This event was both instructional and enjoyable, as letters to the Council from participants bear out. Having the use of George Bowman's yard proved a great draw with members, so much so that some people were unable to attend due to limited numbers. The only disappointment was a lack of NPS Judges attending the Teach-In, which may have been due to the Northern location of this event. To this end Miss Mary Longsdon has offered to arrange a Judges Teach-In to take place in Derbyshire in 1997 to redress the balance, and an Open Day in Leicestershire around March 1997. It was also agreed another Open Day will be scheduled in the North for 1998. Following the demonstration of correct in-hand showing, some

members have requested a similar demonstration of correct turn-out and technique for ridden classes.

CANCELLATION OF SOUTHERN PERFORMANCE EVENT

Due to lack of entries this event had to be cancelled. The Council was disappointed by the lack of interest and, to save wasting time in future on events which will not get adequate support, it was suggested that a questionnaire about what type of events are of interest be sent to Southern members.

COUNCIL MEETINGS TO BE HELD MORE OFTEN

Due to the increasing amount of business the Council finds itself having to deal with, it has been agreed that there will be quarterly meetings, starting on 19 November 1996 at 1.00 pm.

The NPS/Bankers Equine Direct Qualifier was judged this year by Mr R B Charlton, and the winner was Hillhead Lucky Arnold, ridden by Miss Kathryn Waugh. Only 17 ponies competed at Linnel Wood in 1994. This year we had 23 in the novice class and 9 in the open. I believe we can break the 40 barrier soon and I have to admit that the introduction of the novice class - despite my personal reservations - has proved to be the turning point. It is a pleasure to see all the hard work of Bob and Sarah rewarded by the enthusiasm of the competitors. The Trials were strongly influenced this year by a pony which did not even turn up! Christine Robinson's old stallion Frizington Duke was always a strong competitor

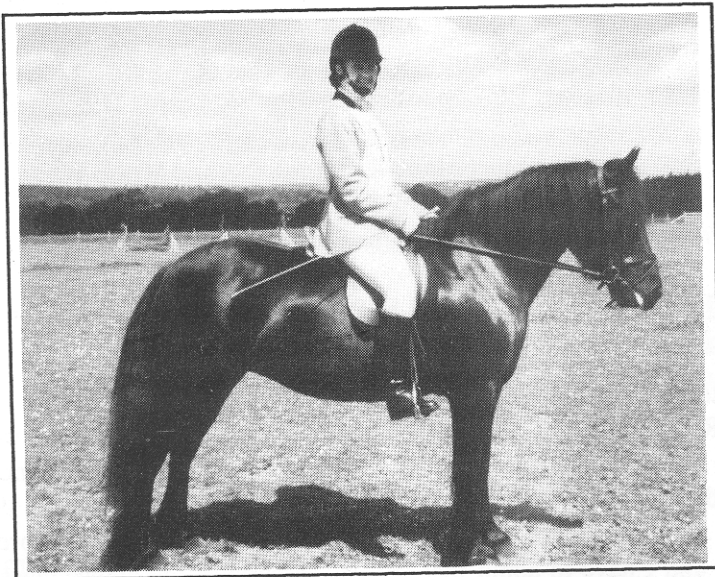

NPS MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND W.H.P. CHAMPIONSHIP 1997

A qualifying round for this Championship has, for a number of years now, preceded the Spring Performance Trials at Linnel Wood. The low number of entries for this important qualifier, which leads to a semi-final at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern in August, has been a matter of some concern. The Final takes place at Wembley at the Horse of the Year Show.

For 1997, in an attempt to boost entries, we have moved the qualifier to the Windermere Fell Pony Show at Brockhole, which will this year be on Sunday 6th July. The qualifier will replace the Open Working Hunter class. To reassure regular competitors at Windermere it should be noted that ponies 13.2 and under are expected to jump between 2'3" and 2'9". Ponies over 13.2 jump 2'9" to 3'3". Prize money is double the usual Windermere rate and it is hoped that members will support this particular class. It is obviously important for our breed to be represented at these major events.

The novice working hunter class at Windermere will be unchanged.

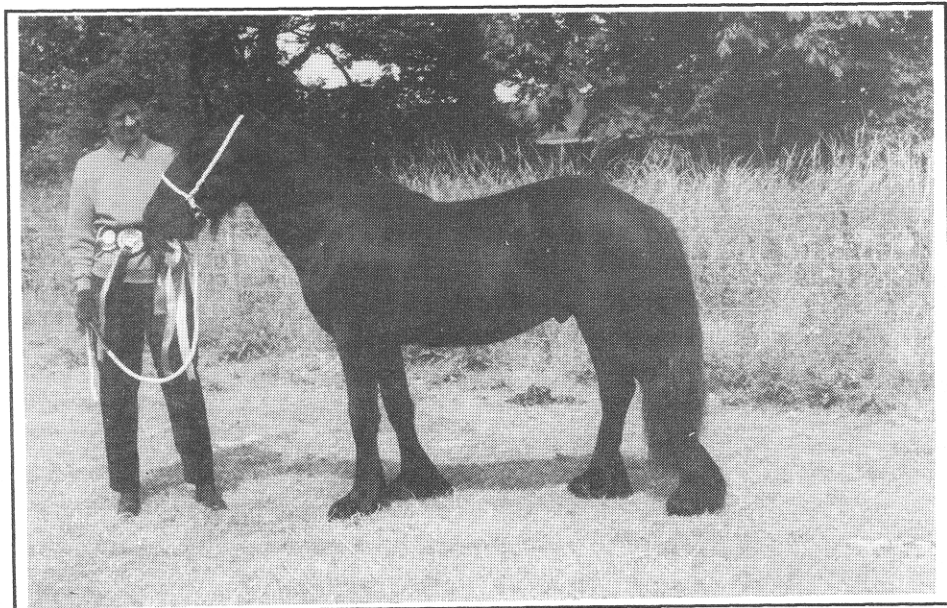
